Autumn Run - Sunday 6th October 2024

The Autumn Run will start at:-New Lanark Mill Cafe, Visitor Centre, New Lanark, ML11 9DH www.newlanark.org

This year's Autumn outing features a trip to "The Best Classic Car Cave in Scotland"

1. Announcement:

The Autumn Run will be held on Sunday 6th October 2024 and is organised by the VSMA. Starting at the New Lanark Mill Cafe situated in the visitor centre where tea/coffee and filled rolls can be purchased. The 70 mile route will head across to Ayshire using scenic country roads to arrive at Gemmell's Garden Centre near Stair in time for lunch. A large selection of hot food, soup, sandwiches and cakes will be available. After lunch we will make our way to Hurlford to visit "The Best Classic Car Cave in Scotland.

2. Eligibility:

The event is open to all members of the Veterans of Scottish Motorsport Association. If not already a Member, Membership can be paid along with entry. Annual Membership is £20 per person.

3. Vehicles:

The event is open to the following:

- a) Cars manufactured before 1980
- b) Sporting cars of any age
- c) Any other cars permitted at the discretion of the organisers. Cars constructed before 1980 will be given preference for entry.

4. Entry List:

The entry list opens on publication of these regulations and entry form. The entry list will close on Monday 30th September 2024.

5. Documentation:

Pre event document inspection and signing on will take place from 10.00am within the New Lanark Mill Cafe in the Visitor Centre. The event will start at 11.00am and you will be given your start time in the final instructions.

6. Scrutineering:

Entrants will be required to sign a declaration to say that they have the following :-

- a) A valid MOT certificate, if applicable.
- b) A valid Road Fund Licence.
- c) A minimum of Third-Party Insurance for all persons who will drive the participating vehicles must be applicable for the duration of the event.

7. Route and Navigation:

The route which will be approximately 70 miles on scenic A and B class and unclassified roads and will all be on sealed surfaces.

A 'tulip' road book will be distributed by e-mail prior to the event. Only in exceptional circumstances will hard copies be issued.

An alternative direct route on only A roads will be provided as an option to be used in the event of inclement weather.

8. Responsible Driving:

Participants must always comply with the requirements of the Road Traffic Acts and drive in a responsible and considerate manner. Please remember other road users, motor cyclists, cyclists, walkers, and livestock. NOTE 20mph speed limits through villages. Quiet roads are designated walking and cycling routes and have a 40-mph speed limit.

9. Entries:

The entry fee is £5 per person, to cover administration costs.

All entries must be made on the entry form and accompanied by the appropriate entry and membership fee if applicable. Due to limited space, maximum number of entries is 20. Entries will be accepted in order of receipt. Email entries will be accepted, as will direct bank transfer payment. Details on the Entry Form.

10. Insurance:

Participants are responsible for ensuring that all drivers of vehicles entered in the event are fully covered by insurance during the event as required by the Road Traffic Acts and will be required to sign a declaration to that effect at the start.

11. Data Protection Act:

Prospective entrants and competitors are advised that information supplied on the entry form will be held on a computer and used for the administration of the event.
